

Transfer to Secondary School in 2021

- Parents and Carers are asked to read the School's Admissions Criteria for 2021 entry which has been published on our website at <u>www.wcgs-sutton.co.uk</u> in the Admissions section. The school offer 150 places for boys into Year 7 each year.
- In order to be considered for a place at Wallington County Grammar School (WCGS), your son must sit the Selective Eligibility Test (SET), he must reach the WCGS pass mark from this test and you must list WCGS as a preference on your Common Application Form (CAF) for him to be eligible to be considered for a place.
- The Selective Eligibility Test (TEST) is run by all 6 of the selective schools in the Borough of Sutton and you only have to register once for your child to sit this test and be considered for a place at any of the participating Schools.

What to do now / The next steps

Date	Action
1 May 2020	The online supplementary registration form has been available from 1 May 2020 for parents/carers to register their child to sit the Selective Eligibility Test in 2020 (for entry into secondary school in September 2021).
	This online registration form is available via the websites of any of the SET participating schools (and you only need to register once for your child to be invited to sit this entrance test and be considered for a place at any of the participating schools).
19 June 2020	For a child with an EHCP, SEND or a medical condition where special access arrangements for the SET is requested, online registration and provision of supporting documents must be done by today.
14 August 2020	Registration for the Selective Eligibility Test closes. You are encouraged to complete the online supplementary registration form in advance of this closing date, as no late registrations will be accepted under any circumstances.
15 September 2020 <mark>**</mark>	**Please note: The date of the Selective Eligibility Test ('SET') is still currently under review.
	If this test date changes or is deferred to later than 15 September 2020, this information will be published on the Wallington County Grammar school website.
	Notification of the result of this test will be emailed out no later than a fortnight after the test.
31 October 2020	The statutory closing date for submission of the Common Application Form to your home Local Authority.
1 March 2021	National Offer Day. Offers of secondary school places will be made by Local Authorities.

Offers of places for all secondary schools will be sent to parents/carers by their home Local Authority on 1 March 2021
